GUIDELINES FOR ASIA PACIFIC REGION PROJECT 3L

Project 3L: “Life-Long Learning” (Project funded by the Friends of Asia Pacific WAGGGS)

Background

Since 1999, Friends of AP WAGGGS (FAPW) has gained enormous support from countries all over the world. FAPW works to raise funds for the development of Girl Guiding and Girl Scouting in the Asia Pacific Region. It was felt that the money collected from the membership fees of FAPW members should be utilized as grants for specific projects for Member Organizations.

The *Project 3L: “Life-Long Learning”* (Project 3L) responds to the needs of Member Organizations to provide opportunity for growth for young women. It is envisaged that Project 3L will give young women skills to use in all aspects of their life; not just those related to Girl Guiding and Girl Scouting.

The project may be conducted at a national level and/or the next tier of decision-making, such as state, region, or province.

Procedure

1. Applications for the project must be submitted by 30 November of the preceding year. Only applications that meet the criteria will be considered.
2. Member Organizations may submit one project proposal per year to the Asia Pacific Regional (APR) Committee.
3. The APR Committee will select up to six projects each year from the proposals submitted by Member Organizations.
4. If a Member Organization has already received a grant within the triennium, preference will be given to a Member Organization that has not received a grant.
5. Member Organizations will be notified after the annual APR Committee meeting as to whether they have been successful.
6. Member Organizations must sign a grant letter, agreeing to the terms and condition of the grant, before receiving the grant money.
7. The APR Committee, through the Regional Director, will monitor the progress of projects ensuring that funds are used as agreed by the Member Organization and the APR Committee. An evaluation form will be sent from the Regional Director to the Member Organization with specific instructions on how to use it.
8. Member Organizations will submit a complete report with photos prior to the APR Committee meeting in the following year. A copy of each report will be sent to FAPW Working Group.
9. Upon completion of the project, Member Organizations must submit an article describing the project and the outcome. The article will be edited and featured in the AP Link News and on the AP website.
10. Certificates of participation from the Asia Pacific Region will be awarded annually to the participants after completion of the project.
11. Certificates of participation from the Asia Pacific Region will be awarded triennially to the Member Organisations after the completion of the project/s, at each Regional Conference.
12. The Member Organizations may be required to demonstrate/share their project at the Regional Conference.

Criteria

1. The project must directly respond to the needs of young women in the country.
2. The project must directly benefit young women.
3. The project must be skills oriented relevant to the personal development of young women.

4. At least 50% of the participants in each project must be members of the Member Organisation under the age of 30.
5. The project must be completed within 12 months.
6. Reports of past projects must be forthcoming.
7. Each project will receive funding only once from Project 3L. The Member Organisation may choose to continue the project through self-funding or alternative funding arrangements.

Funding

1. The maximum amount of grant per project is GBP 2,000.
2. Expenses over the amount of the grant will be the responsibility of the Member Organization.
